



Folded Ornaments

adapted from a model by Didier Boursin

Deck the tree with ornaments that can be spent after the holiday. These variations are easily achieved just by leaving part of a fold open or changing the beads.



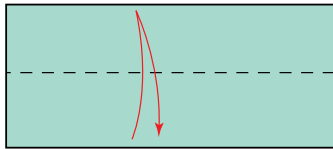
MATERIALS:

1 new bill • 10" White satin ribbon 1/2" wide • Assorted glass beads

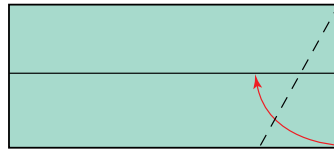
INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Fold ornament.
2. Fold ribbon in half. Knot 1" below the loop.
3. String 2 beads on both ribbons. Knot.
4. String beads on tails. Knot to secure.
5. Close ornament around the ribbon.

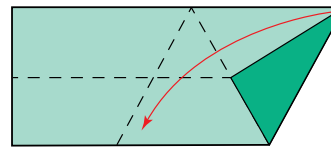

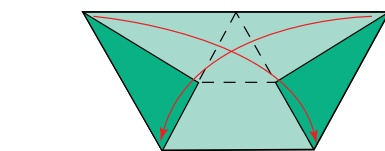
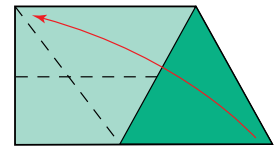
1. Start with the face side down. Fold in half lengthwise. Unfold.



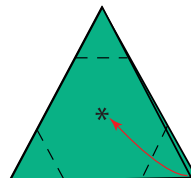
2. Valley fold bottom right corner to center crease. Fold at an angle so the crease ends at the top



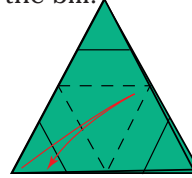
3. Valley fold the right corner so the right folded edge aligns with the bottom of the bill. Valley fold again so the folded edges align with the top edge of the bill.



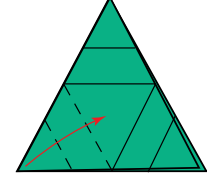
4. Unfold bill and refold bottom left and right edges as shown. Make the bill into a triangle shape by valley folding right and left flaps so they overlap each other.



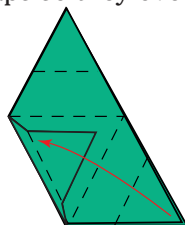
5. Fold all 3 points to center. Unfold



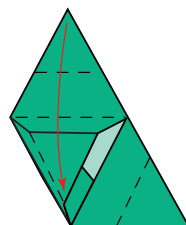
6. Fold all 3 points to opposite edges. Crease well. Unfold.



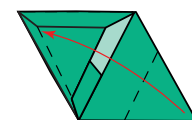
7. To make the ornament 3-dimensional, fold the left side along previous creases so that a small triangle flap is on top.



8. Fold the top layer on right side as in Step 7. Tuck triangle edge into pocket.



9. Fold top edge down and tuck under top triangle flap. Shape with fingers. For ornaments with dangling beads, thread ribbon through opening as pictured.



10. For box pictured far left, tuck under remaining corner and shape into box.
